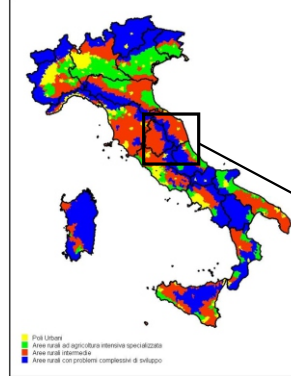

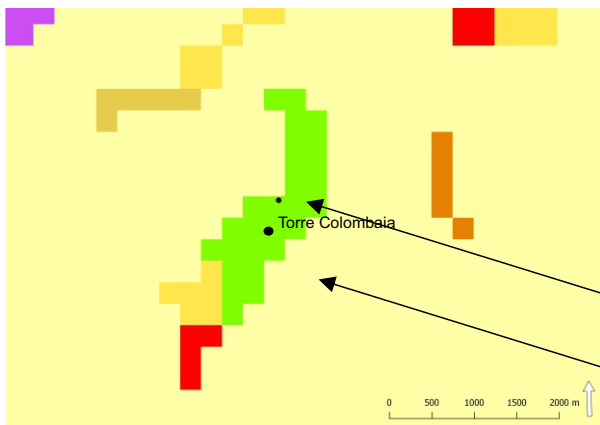
Zoning of the rural areas

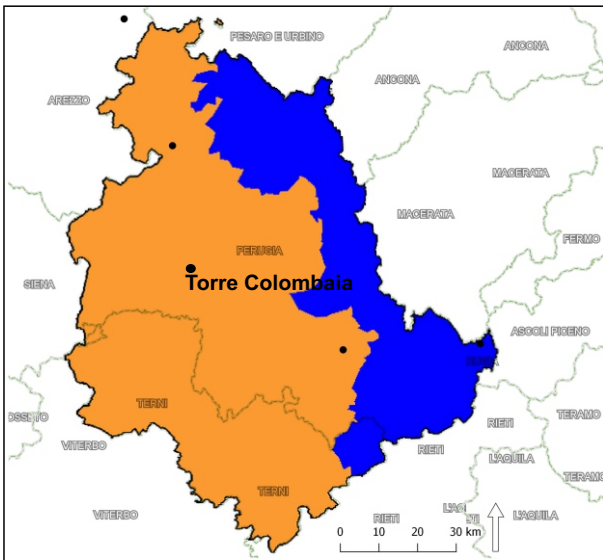

Zoning of the rural areas

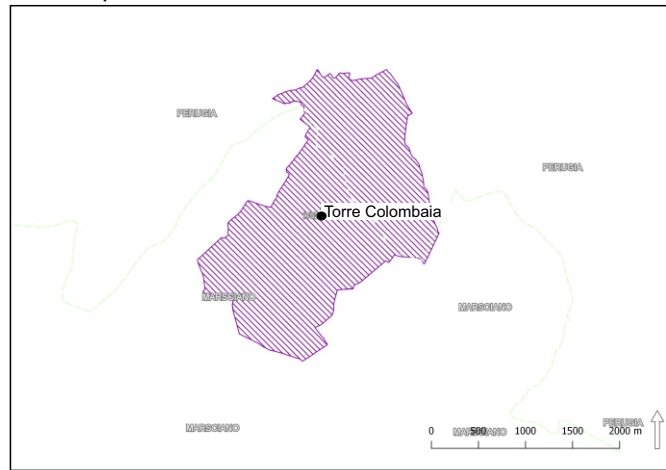


Legend

Natural protected areas



The secular wood surrounds the cultivations as a protection against wind, one of the very few existing examples of this Benedictine wood management.

Torre Colombaia was also one of the first agritourism in Umbria, with accommodation , located in 19th century houses, previously hunt cottages
